
Welcome to your 2015 Impact Report

HOPE & CARING

Because of you...

At the **HEART** of the brain tumour community is the **HOPE** for a cure.

- ✓ 14 brain tumour studies were funded across North America
- √ \$385,355 directed to research projects to help better understand brain tumours and to improve treatment
- √ 5 studentships awarded to promising young brain tumour researchers
- √ 79 tissue samples accepted to the London, ON Brain Tumour Tissue Bank
- ✓ Completed 2-year feasibility study to establish Canada's brain tumour registry
- √ \$230,000 in matching funds from Brain Canada secured for registry project

Improving **QUALITY-OF-LIFE** for brain tumour patients and caregivers is a **TOP PRIORITY**.

- ✓ 5,127 brain tumour handbooks were given to patients and their loved ones
- √ 5 childhood brain tumour survivors were awarded post-secondary school scholarships
- ✓ Launched the brand new Toronto adult brain tumour support group in 2015
- ✓ 500+ Canadian health care workers attended brain tumour education events






INTEGRITY

CHANGING THE WORLD FOR KIDS WITH BRAIN CANCER.

In 2015, Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada partnered with Brain Canada and the Canadian Cancer Society to create the **Pediatric Brain Cancer Impact Grant**.

Over the next four years, Dr. Michael Taylor and his team will study how the most



common pediatric brain cancer (medulloblastoma) responds to different types of treatment.

This breakthrough research focuses on finding personalized care for young children with brain cancer so their developing bodies and minds are not permanently damaged by current standard treatments.
